Resolution

Relative to that part of the Columbia and Philadelphia rail road, which passes through the city of Lancaster.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the Canal Commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and required to pay to the city of Lancaster the sum of sixteen thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven dollars and ninety-one cents, an unpaid part of the appropriation made by a resolution of the twenty-fourth day of April, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, for the purpose of defraying expenses in changing the location of the Columbia and Philadelphia rail-road through the said city, said sum being the balance of said appropriation, after deducting thirteen thousand nine hundred and seventy four dollars and thirty cents, the amount paid by the State for completing with rails the additional length occasioned by the said change.
