Resolution

Explanatory of the act passed the thirteenth April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the meaning of the second section of the act entitled, An act to provide for the further improvement of the State by rail roads and canals, passed the thirteenth of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, shall be taken to be, that the sum of eighty thousand dollars shall be appropriated to the payment of the expenses incurred by the construction of the public works at or near the Dunnstown dam, on the West Branch of the Susquehanna river, as required by that section, and that the sum which by the fifth section of said act, the Governor is authorized to borrow, is nine hundred and fifty-nine thousand, six hundred dollars.
