## A Supplement

To an act to incorporate Haverford School Association, passed the fourth day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-three.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That "Haverford School Association" be, and it is hereby authorized to increase its capital stock, to a sum not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, and the managers of said association shall have full power and authority to fill all vacancies, caused by death, resignation, or other

## An Act

To change the time of appointing the Canal Commissioners.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be the duty of the Governor, on or after the first day of February next, and annually thereafter, to appoint three Canal Commissioners, and in case of vacancy, supply the same by new appointments, whose powers, duties, and compensation, shall be the same as those of the present board, and shall commence on the first of February next, and whose term of service shall continue for one year: *Provided,* That the collectors, weighmasters and lockkeepers now employed on the public works, shall not be removed from office, or discharged from such employment, until the first day of April next, unless for neglect or violation of duty.
