An Act

Authorizing the Governor to incorporate the Somerset and Shanksville turnpike company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and several, the rights, privileges, immunities, grants, restrictions, and limitations given to and imposed upon the Butler and Franklin turnpike road company, by an act entitled "An act to incorporate a company for making a turnpike road from Butler to Franklin," passed the second day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, be and the same are hereby extended to the Somerset and Shanksville turnpike company, to all intents and purposes, and the same is hereby incorporated into a body corporate and politic, by the name, style and title of the Somerset and Shanksville turnpike road company, and the following named persons are appointed commissioners to carry out the provisions of this act, to wit: Jacob Gebhart, George Foy, Jacob Lambert, Jacob Shank, and George Parker: *Provided,* That when twenty or more persons shall have subscribed two hundred shares of stock, the said commissioners may certify, under their hands and seals, the names of the subscribers, and the number of shares subscribed by each, to the Governor of this commonwealth, whereupon, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, by letters patent, under his hand and seal of the state, to create and erect the subscribers, and those who shall afterwards subscribe, into one body politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title aforesaid.
