A Supplement

To the act entitled "An act for the regulation of the militia of this commonwealth," passed the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two.

Citizen Blues

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the volunteer company organized and known by the name of the Citizen Blues, in the county of Indiana, shall not be required to perform military duty in connection with any regiment or battalion of militia, remaining in all other respects subject to the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement.

Proviso.

SECTION 2. That the Franklin Blues and Chambersburg Artillerists of Chambersburg, Franklin county, the York Pennsylvania Riflemen, shall from and after the passage of this act, be exempted from parading or drilling with any regiment or battalion of militia, except at the discretion of said companies: *Provided,* That the above named companies shall meet on the proper number of days required by law, in their company capacity.
