## An Act

To recharter the Bank of Penn township, in the county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the bank of Penn township in the county of Philadelphia, shall be and is hereby extended, for the term of twenty years from and after the passage of this act, under its present conditions, stipulations, rights and privileges, except so far as they are hereinafter altered or repealed. Charter extended 20 yrs

SECTION 2. That the said bank shall have the right to increase its capital stock to the sum of five hundred thousand dollars, the additional stock to be divided into shares of fifty dollars each, to be sold and disposed of by the said bank, at such times, and in such manner as its directors, at their discretion, may think fit and expedient: *Provided,* That all the said additional stock shall be paid in within two years from and after the passage of this act. Right to increase capital stock to \$500,000.

SECTION 3. That in case the said bank shall except of this charter, and advise the Governor of the same, under their corporate seal, within thirty days after the passage of this act, then the said bank shall pay into the treasury of the commonwealth the sum of thirty-three thousand dollars, one half on the first day of May next, and the other half on the Bonus.
