An Act

To authorize a temporary loan for the use of the commonwealth.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorized to negotiate a temporary loan on the credit of the commonwealth, not to exceed two hundred thousand dollars, at an interest of not more than four per centum per annum, as in his opinion may be most advantageous, to pay debts contracted previous to the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, for the repairs and new work on finished lines of the canals and railways of this commonwealth, and the sum or sums of money so borrowed, shall be vested in the commissioners of the internal improvement fund, and applied for the above purpose, reimbursable within one year after the passage of this act, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
