**Resolution**

Authorizing John T. M. Bedell and others, to change their names, and for other purposes.

*Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met,* That John T. M. Bedell, and by the same name shall he be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, grant and receive, and do all other legal acts, as effectually, to all intents and purposes, as he could have done by his former name, if no change had been made therein.

*Resolved,* That Thomas Sheepshanks of the county of Philadelphia, be, and he is hereby authorized to change his name from Thomas Sheepshanks to that of Thomas S.
