An Act

Concerning the proportion of the public money of the United States which Pennsylvania is entitled to receive under the act of Congress passed the twenty-third of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be, and he hereby is authorized to receive from the Treasury of the United States, the money which the said commonwealth is entitled to receive under and by virtue of an act of the Congress of the United States, entitled "An act to regulate the deposits of the public money," passed the twenty-third day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and to execute certificates of deposit therefor, pledging the faith of the state for the safe keeping and repayment thereof, according to the terms and provisions of the act of congress aforesaid.

SECTION 2. And that so much of the money received by the Treasurer under the authority of the first section of this act, as shall be paid by a draft or drafts, on any bank or banks of this commonwealth, shall remain where it is now, or may be deposited on the first day of January next, until other disposition shall be thereof made by law.
