An Act

Authorizing the sale of part of the real estate of Daniel Gregory, late of Susquehanna county, deceased.

WHEREAS, Daniel Gregory, late of Susquehanna county, died seized of certain timber lands, with a saw mill thereon, situate partly in each of the counties of Susquehanna, Bradford and Luzerne, containing one hundred and sixty-three acres and one hundred and sixteen perches of land, which the Orphans' court of said county of Susquehanna has directed to be sold for payment of the debts of decedent, and it being desirable to sell the same in one body and at one sale; Therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the administrators of the estate of said Daniel Gregory, be authorized to sell the said timber land and saw mill at public vendue or outcry, after giving at least three weeks notice in one of the public papers printed in each of the counties of Susquehanna and Bradford, which sale, when duly approved and confirmed by the Orphans' court of Susquehanna county, shall be good and sufficient, notwithstanding said lands lie partly in three several counties, as aforesaid.
