An Act

To authorize Thomas Paschall, guardian of Joseph Paschall, to sell and convey certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Thomas Paschall, guardian of Joseph Paschall, be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to sell at public outcry, upon fifteen days notice, and convey unto the purchaser or purchasers, in fee simple or otherwise, all that part of a certain tract of land devised by Doctor Henry Paschall, deceased, to his son, the said Joseph Paschall, situate in the township of Kingsessing, in the county of Philadelphia, which lies between Levis Passmore's mill race and Cobb's creek: *Provided,* That before any sale Proviso. shall be made, the said guardian shall give security to the satisfaction of the Orphans' court of Philadelphia county, for the faithful execution of the power hereby granted, and the proper application of the proceeds of sale, according to the provisions of the will of said testator.
