An Act

For the erection of a bridge at Starr's Fording, on the Yellow Breeches creek.

WHEREAS, a bridge is much needed by the public across the Yellow Breeches creek, which is one of the division lines between the counties of Cumberland and York, where the road from Carlisle through Lisburn, in the former county, to York Haven, crosses said creek, at the fording commonly called Starr's Fording: *And whereas*, grand juries in both of said counties have approved of the commissioners of Cumberland and York erecting a bridge across said fording, at the joint expense of their respective counties, but the same has never been built, on account of some informality in and loss of the record returned to the court of Quarter Sessions of York county; Therefore,

Preamble.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the commissioners of the counties of Cumberland and York may erect a bridge, at the joint expense of their respective counties, across the Yellow Breeches creek, at the fording commonly called Starr's Fording, on said creek, without any compliance with the provisions of the acts of the general assembly in relation to the erection of county bridges by adjoining counties: *Provided always*, That the said bridge when built, shall in all respects be subject to the provisions of the several acts aforesaid.
