An Act

To repeal so much of the fifth section of an act to consolidate and amend the several acts relative to a General System of Education by Common Schools, as authorizes the school directors to levy and assess a poll tax.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, so much of the fifth section of an act to consolidate and amend the several acts relative to a general system of education by common schools, passed the thirteenth day of June, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, authorizing the school directors of each and every school district within this commonwealth to levy a poll tax, at their discretion, not exceeding fifty cents, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

An Act

For the relief of David Conner and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to David Conner, Jacob Muck, and John Duck, of Union county, Jacob Pott of Berks

county, Thomas Holt of Mifflin county, Jacob Remel and Jacob Knecht of Northampton county, Ephraim Turk of York county, and Simon Fox of Huntingdon, soldiers, and to Catharine Allison of Franklin county, Margaret Ehler and Margaret Lombort of Lancaster county, and Barbara Delavan of the city of Philadelphia, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven.

SECTION 2. That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to James Cowen and John W. Hollingsworth of Westmoreland county, and Benoni Williams of Indiana county, soldiers, and Elizabeth Morrison of Cumberland county, a widow of a soldier of the Indian war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven; the foregoing gratuities and pensions to be paid in conformity with the existing laws.
