Hollingsworth of Westmoreland county, and Benoni Williams of Indiana county, soldiers, and Elizabeth Morrison of Cumberland county, a widow of a soldier of the Indian war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven; the foregoing gratuities and pensions to be paid in conformity with the existing laws.

An Act

For the relief of John Adams and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Adams of Huntingdon county, William Clark of Columbia county, John Turner of Allegheny

county, Joseph Norman of Philadelphia county, Abraham Goss of Clearfield county, soldiers, and Susanna Row of Berks county, a widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars to each for life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven.

SECTION 2. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Evans of Indiana county, and Henry Dieder of Westmoreland county, soldiers of the Indian war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars to each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven; these annuities and gratuities to be paid in conformity with the existing laws.

SECTION 3. That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Rebecca Patton, widow of John Patton, late of Huntingdon county, deceased, the sum of forty dollars, which by act passed the fifteenth day of June last, was granted to her said late husband, who died without having received the same.
