A Supplement

To the act entitled, "An act for the conveyance of certain real estate, and for other purposes," approved the twenty-eighth day of March, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

Relative to sales of real estate of Samuel Bechtel, late of Bedford county, deceased.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all such sale or sales of any part of the real estate of Samuel Bechtel, late of Bedford county, deceased, and conveyances made therefor to the purchaser or purchasers thereof, which have been, or shall hereafter be made by David Hunter and Hugh Rankin, of said Bedford county, under and in pursuance of the eighth section of the act entitled "An act for the conveyance of certain real estate, and for other purposes," approved the twenty-eighth day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six; shall be held and deemed valid, any mistakes in the printing, contained in the said eighth section, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Mountain land in Air township, Bedford co.

SECTION 2. That the said David Hunter and Hugh Rankin, shall have power to sell two-thirds of a tract of mountain land, part of the estate of said Samuel Bechtel, deceased, situated in Air township, in said Bedford county, and convey

to the purchaser or purchasers, all such right and title as the said decedent had therein at and immediately before his death, subject however, to the same restrictions and limitations contained in the eighth section of the act approved the twenty-eighth day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

SECTION 3. The house situate on the south west corner of Spruce and Delaware Seventh streets, in the city of Philadelphia, now owned and occupied by an institution called the Roman Catholic Society of St. Joseph, for educating and maintaining poor orphan children, together with the lot of ground whereon the same is erected, be, and the same is hereby exempted from taxation, so long as it shall continue to be the property of that charitable institution, and used for an asylum, as aforesaid, and no longer.

WHEREAS, The legislature of the commonwealth of Delaware, did on the fifteenth of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, pass an act entitled "A further additional supplement to an act entitled 'An act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the Chesapeake bay and bay and river Delaware, or the waters thereof;'" *And whereas*, The legislature of the commonwealth of Maryland, in May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, did likewise pass a bill, entitled "A further additional supplement to an act entitled 'An act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the river Delaware and Chesapeake bay;'" *And whereas*, the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal company have desired the sanction of the legislative authority of this commonwealth;

SECTION 4. That the act of the legislature of the state of Delaware, entitled "A further additional supplement to an act entitled 'An act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the Chesapeake bay and bay and river Delaware, or the waters thereof,'" passed the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and the act of the legislature of the state of Maryland, entitled "A further additional supplement to an act entitled 'An act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the river Delaware and Chesapeake bay,'" passed in May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, are hereby recognized, approved and confirmed, and declared to be valid and of full force and virtue, in the same manner, and to the same effect as if the same were incorporated word for word, and section for section, into this act.

Relative to the journeymen saddlers' & trimmers' beneficial society of the city and county of Phil'a.
 Proviso.

SECTION 5. From and after the passing of this act, the Journeymen Saddlers' Harness Makers' and Trimmers' Beneficial society of the city and county of Philadelphia, be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to elect to membership in said society any person over the age of twenty-one years, actually residing within the city or county of Philadelphia, whether such person be a citizen of this commonwealth or not: *Provided always*, That no such person, if an alien by birth, shall be admitted to membership, unless he shall have first declared his intention to become a citizen, agreeably to the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided.

The Pittsburg Saving Fund company authorized to increase their stock and deposits.
 Repeal of part of act of April 8th 1833.

SECTION 6. From and after the passage of this act, The Pittsburg Saving Fund company shall, and they are hereby authorized to increase their stock and deposits to the amount of two hundred thousand dollars, and the proviso in the eighth section of the act to incorporate the Pittsburg Saving Fund company, passed eighth April, eighteen hundred and thirty-three, limiting the capital stock and amount of deposits in said company to one hundred thousand dollars, be, and the same is hereby repealed; and that so much of the sixth section of the act which provides that no person shall be elected to the office of treasurer of said company, who is not a member thereof, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Commissioner's of Philad'a. co. authorized, with consent of controller of public schools to sell lot of ground, &c.

SECTION 7. The commissioners of the county of Philadelphia, by and with the advice and consent of the controllers of public schools of the first school district of this commonwealth, be, and they are hereby authorized to sell and convey a certain lot or piece of ground, with the buildings thereon erected, situate in Marlborough street, between Duke and West streets, in the district of Kensington, now occupied for the use of public schools; and that the money derived from the sale of the same, shall be paid into the treasury of the county of Philadelphia, to be applied to school purposes in the said first school district, and that the commissioners of Kensington district of Philadelphia county, shall have full power and authority to alter or regulate the height of that portion of Penna street laying between Marsh and Maiden streets in the above named district, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Commissioner's of Kensington district authorized to regulate part of Penna st.
