An Act

For the relief of Joseph Fulton and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Joseph Fulton of Columbia county, Boreck Becktel, Evan Evans, Alexander Nesbit, and Felix Chrisman of Chester county, and Henry Davidsheiser of Berks county, soldiers, and Margaret Schaum of Lancaster county, Christina Camp of Crawford county, and Margaret Shitzell of Philadelphia county, and Catharine Hood of the city of Philadelphia, the widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven. Annuities & gratuities of \$40 each, to Jos. Fulton, and others, soldiers etc.

SECTION 2. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Jacob Gerber of Lancaster county, Alexander Shaw and David Shaw of Westmoreland county, soldiers of the Indian war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven. Gratuities & annuities of \$40 each, to Jacob Gerber and David Shaw.

SECTION 3. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Rice of the borough of Northampton, in the county of Lehigh, or to his order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, in trust for the use and benefit of Gertrude Rinker of Lehigh county, the widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war, and an annuity of forty dollars during the life of the said Gertrude Rinker, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, which said gratuity and annuity, shall be applied by the said trustee towards the maintenance and support of the said Gertrude Rinker, from time to time, as in his opinion her necessities may require. Gratuity and annuity of \$40 each, to John Rice for the use of Gertrude Rinker.

SECTION 4. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Frederick Keefer of Franklin county, and

Gratuity of Samuel Morrison of York county, soldiers of the revolution-
 \$40 each, to ry war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, in
 F. Keefer & full for their military services during the revolutionary war;
 S. Morrison. the foregoing gratuities and annuities to be paid in conform-
 ity with existing laws.

An Act

Authorizing James Worth, a surviving executor of the last will
 and testament of Isaac Knight, and trustee appointed therein, to
 cut and sell certain wood upon the estate devised to him in trust,
 and to authorize the sale of the estate of John Brown, deceased.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Re-*
presentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in Gen-
eral Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority
of the same, That it shall and may be lawful, if the Orphans'

Worth, sole surviving executor of the last will and testament
 of Isaac Knight, late of Abington township, in the county of
 Montgomery, deceased, and devisee in trust of a certain
 messuage and plantation, or tract of two hundred acres of
 land, more or less, for Mary Elizabeth Worth and her child-
 ren, to cut down or sell so much of the standing wood and
 timber on the said plantation or tract of land, as may be cut
 or sold without injury to said land, and the moneys there-
 from arising, to invest under the order of the Orphans' court
 for the county of Montgomery, in such securities as are here-
 inafter provided for, and the income and interest of the
 money so invested, shall be received by the said trustee
 during the life time of the said Mary Elizabeth Worth, and
 paid to her for her sole and separate use, and the said prin-
 cipal monies so invested, shall, upon the decease of the said
 Mary Elizabeth Worth, go and be paid to the person or
 persons to whom the said estate shall then go, according
 to the provisions in said will: *Provided*, That before the
 said James Worth shall proceed to cut down or sell stand-
