

said commissioners shall each receive from the township of Blockley, and borough of West Philadelphia, equally out of the road tax, for the services, not exceeding fifty dollars in any one year, and such other allowance for the pay of the surveyors, and the costs of making the plans and drafts, as the councils of West Philadelphia may determine or agree to: *Provided*, That none of the said streets, roads, lanes or Proviso. alleys, shall be opened, but by due course of law: *And provided also*, That the township of Blockley, and borough of West Philadelphia, shall in equal portions, pay the expense of the said survey and plans. ^{2d Proviso.}

SECTION 14. That Samuel Roseburg, W. W. Irvin, James Ross, Jr. Joseph Welsh, P. Mulvany, S. Gormly, W. A. Simpson, T. S. Clarke, William Witty, A. Curting, R. C. Stockton, H. M. Watts, and Thomas Liggett, Jr. be, and they are hereby appointed and authorized as commissioners to carry out and perform the provisions of an act, entitled "An act to incorporate the Pittsburg Savings' Institution," passed the eleventh day of April, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and thirty-four, said commissioners to be in the stead and place of those mentioned in said act, and the commissioners named in this section, shall be invested with the rights and powers. rights and powers given in the act to which this a supplement.

An Act

For the relief of Joseph Wilt, late Brigade Inspector of Lehigh county, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to refund to Joseph Wilt, late

State Treasurer to refund to Jos. Wilt \$203. Brigade Inspector of the second brigade, seventh division, of the Pennsylvania Militia, or order, the sum of two hundred and three dollars, being in full for certain fines paid by him to the State Treasurer, on the settlement of his account on the thirtieth day of March, eighteen hundred and twenty-seven, with the Auditor General, which said sum of two hundred and three dollars, is the amount of fines which were assessed in the second battalion, one hundred and thirty-eighth regiment, in the year eighteen hundred and twenty-six, and never received by the said Brigade Inspector.

SECTION 2. That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby required and directed to pay out of the state treasury, to William Stephens, late county treasurer for the county of Philadelphia, the sum of forty-six dollars, being the amount paid by him for books now in the county treasurer's office of Philadelphia, and stationary for the use of the state, during the three years he officiated in said office.

State Treasurer to pay Wm. Stephens, Treasurer of Phila. county, \$46.

SECTION 3. All and every the acts, contracts, and doings of the commissioners of Fayette county, relative to the expenditure of three thousand dollars for the repair of the state road leading from the top of the Allegheny mountain to the flats of Grave creek, appropriated by an act entitled "An act to repeal the state tax on real and personal property, and to continue and extend the improvements of the state by railroads and canals, and to charter a state bank, to be called the 'United States Bank,'" passed the eighteenth day of February, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, be, and the same are hereby confirmed and made valid, and the said commissioners, and all concerned, shall have full power to enforce and perfect the same, as if entered into with full authority, any law, usage, or custom, to the contrary notwithstanding: *Provided*, That the said commissioners shall submit their accounts to the auditors of the said county of Fayette, to be by them audited, in the same way other accounts are audited, who shall publish the same with the receipts and expenditures of the said county.

Relative to expenditure of \$3,000 on state road.

Proviso.

SECTION 4. That the said commissioners shall have power to expend any balance of the said three thousand dollars which may be in their hands, at any time before the first day of July, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven.

Balance of \$3,000 may be expended.
