

of the same, That the State Treasurer, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to George Keller of Berks county, Peter Harder of Columbia county, Alexander Walker of Beaver county, George Stetzer of Mifflin county, soldiers, and Mary Miller of Franklin county, Mary Hilard of Fayette county, and Anna Madeira of Monongalia county, Virginia, widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary war, or to their orders respectively, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars annually, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven.

SECTION 2 That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Robert Cooper of Westmoreland county, John Wilkins of Jefferson county, George Kinzer of Allegheny county, George Upsinger of Huntingdon county, and Jacob Slough of Lancaster county, soldiers of the Indian war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven.

SECTION 3 That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Elisha Henwood, and Alexander M'Cready, of Washington county, Jacob Dufferder of Lancaster county, and Charles Straub of Union county, soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, in full for the services performed by them during said wars; the foregoing gratuities and pensions to be paid in conformity with existing laws.

An Act

To pay certain loans of this commonwealth, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in Gen-*

Preamble re- *eral Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority*
 lative to loans *of the same,* That whereas, several stock and company
 amounting to loans of this commonwealth, amounting to the sum of one
 \$175,000. hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars, become due and
 payable the present year; *And whereas,* provision should be
 made to discharge said debts, that the State Treasurer be,
 State Treas'r. and he is hereby authorized and required to pay the same
 to pay the said loans. out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropri-
 ated, when the same become due, according to the terms of
 said loans.

Auditors ap- SECTION 2. That Samuel Lane, John Nill, and Samuel

Duty of Au- SECTION 3. That when the said auditors shall have ascer-
 ditors. tained the amount of the taxes so remaining unpaid, and the
 amount of costs paid by the said David Smetzer, they shall
 certify the same, under their hands and seals, or under the
 hands and seals of a majority of them, to the supervisors of
 the township of Washington, in Franklin county, whose
 duty it shall be, together with the other township officers, to
 pay the same out of any money in the hands of said supervi-
 sors, or other officers, with interest from such time as said
 auditors shall direct, and in case there should not be funds
 sufficient in the hands of the supervisors, or other officers
 of the township of Washington, to pay the amount so found
 by the said auditors, then and in that case, it shall be the
 duty of the said supervisors and other officers, to levy a tax
 on said township of Washington, sufficient to pay the amount
 so found, the said auditors receiving each one dollar per day
 for each and every day they shall or may be employed therein,
 to be paid out of the township funds: *Provided,* That before
 they enter upon the duties of their appointment, they be
 sworn or affirmed before some justice of the peace.
