 at any time after thirty years, purchase the right of the said  
 company to their works, upon paying the said company the  
 cost thereof, including all charges, and interest on the same  
 at the rate of eight per cent. per annum.

Power to lo- SECTION 21. The president and managers of the Pitts-  
 cate and con- burg, Kittanning and Warren Railroad company, shall have  
 struct. full power and authority to locate and construct a railroad,  
 with as many tracks as they may deem expedient, with all  
 necessary fixtures for the regulation and well being of the  
 same, from the Allegheny river, at the borough of Franklin,  
 to the Ohio river, at or near the borough of Beaver, by the  
 most direct and eligible route, subjected to all the privileges  
 and penalties provided for and enjoined by the act incorpora-  
 ting said company.

### An Act

Appropriating the state dividends of stock held in the Youngmans-  
 town and Bellefonte Turnpike Road, in aid of the Lewisburg and  
 Youngmanstown Turnpike Road, and for the preservation of the  
 Cumberland road, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Re-  
 presentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in Gen-*

eral Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the dividends declared, or to be declared, upon the stock held by the state in the Youngmanstown and Bellefonte turnpike road, be, and the same are hereby appropriated to the payment of the debt due by the company incorporated to make a turnpike road from the south end of the Lewisburg bridge to Youngmanstown: *Provided*, That the sum so appropriated, shall not exceed the sum of twenty-four hundred dollars.

SECTION 2. That the said dividends shall be paid into the State Treasury, by the Youngmanstown and Bellefonte Turnpike company, in the usual way, and the State Treasurer is hereby directed to pay the same, to the amount limited in the first section of this act, to the president and managers of the Lewisburg and Youngmanstown Turnpike road company, upon their depositing in the office of the State Treasurer, certificates of stock to the amount of such payments, and the dividends upon such certificates of stock shall be thenceforth from time to time paid into the State Treasury, as they shall be declared by the company.

SECTION 3. From and after the passage of this act, all persons engaged in the transportation of fuel for home consumption, on that part of the Cumberland Road which passes through Pennsylvania, shall be exempt from the payment of toll, any thing in the act for the preservation and repair of the Cumberland Road to the contrary notwithstanding.

SECTION 4. The supervisors of roads in every town, township, or borough, within the county of Northumberland, be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, under the penalties provided by the present road laws, to make and keep in good repair all public roads and highways that have or may become so by law, within said county.

WHEREAS, the commissioners named in the act of the tenth April, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, authorizing the laying out of a state road from Bethlehem and Sumneytown road, in Lehigh county, to the Bethlehem and Philadelphia road, in Bucks county, did proceed to lay out and confirm said road, and that part which lies in Lehigh county was duly opened, and bridges erected, but that part of it which lies in the county of Bucks has not been opened, in consequence of its being over five degrees from a horizontal line mentioned in said act; Therefore,

SECTION 5. The court of Quarter Sessions of Bucks county, are hereby authorized to cause that part of the road aforesaid, which lies in Bucks county, to be opened, in the same manner, and to the same extent as is now provided by law for opening county roads.

Superintendents of roads township, shall have full power to employ one or more person or persons, to be superintendents of the roads, for the purpose of making and keeping the same in good order and repair, and the said commissioners shall not, after the passage of this act, put the whole or any part of any road or roads in said township, under contract, for the repair of the same, as is usual in the incorporated parts of the county of Philadelphia, and so much of any act as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is so far, and no farther, repealed.

### A Supplement

To the act entitled "An act to authorize the printing and distribution of the Pamphlet Laws in the German language, passed January twenty-third, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the price of paper and printing of the Pamphlet Laws in the German language, as provided for by the act to which this is a supplement, shall be two and one half cents per sheet for each copy, including translation, and that the price of folding, stitching, and delivering, shall not exceed four and one half cents a copy; the number of copies to be printed for the present year, shall be two thousand, and that so much of the act to which this is a supplement, as is hereby altered or supplied, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. That the minutes of the council of the proprietary Government, from the year one thousand six hundred and eighty-one, to one thousand seven hundred and seventeen, inclusive, which are deposited in the office of the Secretary of this Commonwealth, with a suitable index, and
