

Superintendents of roads in Penn township. SECTION 6. The commissioners of unincorporated Penn township, shall have full power to employ one or more person or persons, to be superintendents of the roads, for the purpose of making and keeping the same in good order and repair, and the said commissioners shall not, after the passage of this act, put the whole or any part of any road or roads in said township, under contract, for the repair of the same, as is usual in the incorporated parts of the county of Philadelphia, and so much of any act as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is so far, and no farther, repealed.

A Supplement

To the act entitled "An act to authorize the printing and distribution of the Pamphlet Laws in the German language, passed January twenty-third, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the price of paper and printing of the Pamphlet Laws in the German language, as provided for by the act to which this is a supplement, shall be two and one half cents per sheet for each copy, including translation, and that the price of folding, stitching, and delivering, shall not exceed four and one half cents a copy; the number of copies to be printed for the present year, shall be two thousand, and that so much of the act to which this is a supplement, as is hereby altered or supplied, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. That the minutes of the council of the proprietary Government, from the year one thousand six hundred and eighty-one, to one thousand seven hundred and seventeen, inclusive, which are deposited in the office of the Secretary of this Commonwealth, with a suitable index, and

such introductory matter as may be deemed proper, be immediately printed, in the octavo form, under the direction of the said Secretary, to the number of one thousand copies: *Provided*, That the cost does not exceed three thousand Proviso. dollars.

SECTION 3. That two hundred copies of the said minutes, when printed, shall be placed in the hands of the Governor, ^{To be distributed & how.} to be by him distributed among learned societies and public libraries, in other States of this Union, at his discretion; that twenty copies shall be presented to the director of the Philadelphia Athenæum, twenty copies to the Historical Society, to be by them deposited as they may think best for their preservation and safe keeping, one copy to each of the several colleges within the commonwealth, five copies to the Franklin Library, in the city of Philadelphia, and one copy deposited in each of the several record offices in the commonwealth, and one copy placed in the hands of the members of the present Legislature, five copies in the State Library, and one copy in each of the public libraries of the State, five copies to the Historical Society.

SECTION 4. That the Secretary of this Commonwealth shall prepare and report to the legislature at their next session, a list of the Colonial documents deposited in his office, ^{Relative to Colonial documents.} with his opinion as to those that are worthy of preservation by means of the press, and the probable expense of publishing the same.

SECTION 5. That the said Secretary of the Commonwealth shall cause the original charter of Pennsylvania, now in his office, ^{Original charter to be framed.} to be framed, covered with glass, and placed in said office, for the inspection of visitors, and that the expense thereof be paid out of any funds in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
