Resolution

Relative to removing the office of the Schuylkill Bank, at Port Carbon, to Pottsville.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That it shall be lawful for the Schuylkill bank, in the city of Philadelphia, to remove their branch from Port Carbon, in Schuylkill county, to Pottsville, in said county, at any time after the first of July, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven. Removal of Bank.

Resolved, That when the office of discount and deposit aforesaid shall have been removed, it shall be the duty of the directors of the Schuylkill bank, to select from among the stockholders of said bank residing in Schuylkill county, five directors, to manage the concerns of the said office for one year, or until others are chosen, which selection is to be made from year to year, as long as the said office shall remain in the said borough. Five Directors to be elected.

Resolved, That the tenth section of the act entitled "An act to authorize John Gamber, of Dauphin county, to construct a canal or slip from the Pennsylvania Canal to his furnace, and for other purposes," passed the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, be, and the same is hereby repealed, and that the company in said section mentioned, shall elect their directors on the first Monday in May next, and on the first Monday in every May thereafter annually. Repeal of the 10th section of act of June 16h, 1836, authorizing J. Gamber to construct a canal, etc.
