Resolution

Relative to the Bridge at Duncan's Island.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the Canal Commissioners be, and they are hereby directed to carry on the work upon the new towing-path bridge across the Susquehanna, at Duncan's Island, as rapidly as may be consistent with its proper and economical construction, and that in case the appropriation of sixty thousand dollars already made to that object, shall be exhausted before the second week of the next session of the legislature, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor to draw his warrant, or warrants, on the State Treasurer, in favor of the proper disbursing officer, for such further sum or sums as are necessary to carry on the work, such moneys to be accounted for by the disbursing officer in the usual way, and such sums not to be larger than he is by law allowed to receive at any one time.
