

ture not amount to the sum above mentioned, the balance thereof shall be considered as a part of the ordinary repair fund, and three hundred thousand dollars to be applied to the repairs on the canals and rail roads of the commonwealth, whereof fourteen thousand dollars shall be applied to repair the aqueduct at Duncan's Island, and sixteen thousand dollars shall be applied to the completion of the three locks on the Eastern division, near Duncan's Island; and the Governor is hereby authorized and required to borrow on permanent loan, the sum of one million two hundred and eighty thousand dollars, to be applied as aforesaid, at an interest not exceeding five per cent per annum, payable half yearly and to be reimbursed at any time after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and he shall issue negotiable certificates of stock for the same transferable on the books of the Auditor General, or at the Bank of Pennsylvania, by the owner or owners of the same, and upon such transfer, new certificates shall be issued by the Auditor General and State Treasurer, or by the president and cashier of said bank, to the new holder or holders, and the interest on said stock shall be paid at the state treasury, the Bank of Pennsylvania, in Philadelphia, or elsewhere, as may be agreed upon by the Governor, and the original purchaser of the stock.

## AN ACT

For the relief of John Danfield and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the*

*authority of the same*, That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Danfield, Anna Margaret Glencer, Magdalena Fisher, and Maria Lott, of Berks county, Martin Harlinger and Benaiah Holdren of Bucks county, Martin Worwert, George Hammer, Maria Gray, Susanna Messersmith, Elizabeth Biemensderfer, Catharine Reisinger, and Ann Morris, of Lancaster county, Elizabeth Reomer, of Franklin county, John Beauty, of Cumberland county, William M'Glaughlin and James Armstrong, of Washington county, Catharine Shinkle, of Philadelphia county, John Jamieson, (Scotch,) of Indiana county, Abraham Zimmerman, of Schuylkill county, Jacob Ross, of Union county, John Haging, of Fayette county, and Jacob Steinmetz, of Allegheny county, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, respectively, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, to be paid half yearly, commencing on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.

**SECTION 2.** The state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Elizabeth Bausman, of Lancaster county, the widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war or her order, eighty dollars immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, to be paid half yearly, commencing on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine. And so much of the third section of an act, entitled "An for the relief of John Vanzant, and other soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars," passed the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, as grants a gratuity and annuity to "Elizabeth Bainman of Lancaster county," be and the same is hereby repealed.

**SECTION 3.** The state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to George Albright, of Lancaster county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or his order, an annuity of forty dollars during life, to be paid half yearly, commencing on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine. And so much of the third section of an act entitled "An act for the relief of John Vanzant, and other soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars," passed on the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight as requires the state treasurer "to pay to Robert Spear, in trust for the use and benefit of George Albright, of Lancaster county," a gratuity and annuity, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. The state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Christiana Goodman, of Columbia county, the widow of Peter Goodman, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to her order, forty dollars immediately as a gratuity in full for military services rendered by her husband; the foregoing gratuities and annuities to be paid in conformity to the existing laws.

## AN ACT

To annul the marriage contract of William L. Denison, and Jane M. Denison.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the marriage contract entered into by and between William L. Denison, and Jane M. Denison his wife, be and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released and discharged from the said contract and from all the legal duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully, effectually and absolutely as if they had never been joined in marriage.
