## AN ACT

For the election of Inspectors and Judges of Elections in the township of Moyamensing, in the county of Philadelphia, and providing for the manner of electing commissioners in the district of Southwark, in the said county, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified voters of the township of Moyamensing, in the county of Philadelphia, shall at their constables' election on the third Friday of March, instant, elect four inspectors and two judges of elections, who shall serve till others are elected, viz :

The qualified voters of East Moyamensing, shall elect for said district, two inspectors and one judge, and the qualified voters of West Moyamensing, shall elect two inspectors and one judge for said district. The inspectors and judges to be elected as follows : Each voter shall vote for one person for inspector and one person for judge, the two persons voted for as inspectors, who shall be found to have the highest number of votes shall be the inspectors, and the person who shall have the highest number of votes for judge, shall be the judge. And in case the person who shall have received the second highest number of votes for inspector shall not attend on the day of any election, then the person who shall have received the second highest number of votes for judge of the election, shall act as an inspector in his place. And in case the person who shall have received the highest number of votes for inspector, shall not attend any election, then the person elected judge of the election shall appoint an inspector in his place, and in case the person elected a judge shall not attend, then the inspector who received the highest number of votes shall appoint a judge ; each inspector shall appoint a clerk.

SECTION 2. Besides the inspectors and judges now elected or appointed, or that may hereafter be elected or appointed, under existing laws, to officiate at the constables' election aforesaid, the person or persons who were next highest in votes as inspector or inspectors, at the last general election, or in case of their not attending, the person who was next highest in votes as assessor, at the last election, shall act as inspectors jointly with the regularly elected or appointed officers of the

constables' election, and each of the inspectors thus added, shall appoint one of the two clerks, but shall have no voice in the appointment of judges of the election.

SECTION 3. That the commissioners of the incorporated district of Southward, in the county of Philadelphia, shall hereafter be elected by general ticket, by the qualified voters of the whole district, that from and after the passage of this act, the seventy fourth section of the act entitled an act regulating election districts, passed April sixteenth, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, be and the same is hereby repealed.

## AN ACT

Authorizing the citizens of Ohio township, in the county of Beaver, to elect an additional supervisor, in said township,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the qualified electors of the township of Ohio, in the county of Beaver, to elect one supervisor in addition to the number to which they were heretofore entitled by law, at the same time and in the same way and manner that constables, supervisors and other township officers are elected in said township.
