AN ACT

To extend the limits of the borough of Towanda, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the boundaries of the borough of Towanda, in the county of Bradford, be and the same are hereby extended, and declared to be as follows: commencing on the Susquehanna river, at the eastern termination of the line between the farms of Hiram Mix, and Francis Delpuech, thence westwardly along said line, to the north-west corner of said Mix's farm, thence south, three degrees west, to the south line of the farm of Enos Tomkins and Thomas Elliott, thence eastwardly along said line, to the Susquehanna river aforesaid, thence up said river according to the courses thereof to the beginning. Boundaries extended

SECTION 2. That the said borough of Towanda and the township of Towanda, in the county of Bradford, shall be and the same are hereby declared to be separated, and shall hereafter act as distinct communities in reference to county rates and levies, the school laws, and to all intents and purposes as any two townships are separate, and the said borough shall be a separate election district, and the general elections shall be holden at the court house in the said borough. SECTION 3. That all the laws of this commonwealth now in force, relative to the borough of Towanda, not inconsistent with the provisions of this act, and all the laws and ordinances of the said borough shall have full force and effect throughout the same, as extended by the first section of this act.
