AN ACT

To incorporate "The Friendship Engine and Hose Company," in Chambersburg.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every the persons who shall at the time of passing this act, be members of the association, called "The friendship engine and hose company," in Chambersburg, shall be, and they are hereby created and declared to be one body politic and corporate, by the name, style, and title of "The friendship engine and hose company," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, in all courts of record, or elsewhere; and, also, the said corporation, and their successors, at all times hereafter, be able to purchase, receive, have and hold, and enjoy, to them and their successors all and all manner of lands, tenements, rents, annuities, liberties, franchises, and other hereditaments, goods and chattels, of what nature, kind, or quality, soever, real, personal or mixed, or choses in action, and the same, from time to time, to sell, grant, demise, alien, and dispose of: *Provided,* That the clear yearly value or income of the said corporation, shall not exceed thirteen hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-three cents, and also to make and have a common seal, and the same to break and renew at pleasure; and also to ordain, establish, and put in execution such by-laws, ordinances, and regulations, as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to the constitution and laws of the United States, or of this commonwealth, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do, for the well being of the said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof.

SECTION 2. Nothing in this act contained shall be deemed to authorize the said company to engage either directly, or indirectly, in any banking, moneyed, commercial, or manufacturing concern, or to act in any other way than as a fire engine and hose company.

SECTION 3. That the legislature reserves the power to alter, revoke, or annul the privileges and charter hereby granted, whenever, in their opinion, the same may be injurious to the citizens of the commonwealth, in such manner, however, that no injustice shall be done to the incorporators.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Governor to incorporate the Manor turnpike Road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That for the purpose of making a turnpike road, from the commencement of Manor street, where the same intersects West King street, in the city of Lancaster, along the said Manor street or road, to where the Little Conestoga creek crosses the same, at a point called the Lake Mill, Abraham Peters, Jacob Huber, Benjamin Herr, Christian Lintner, John Lintner, Daniel Lintner, Jacob Peters, Jacob Mellinger, George Ford, jr., John Brady, John Bausman, Jacob Shenk, Christopher Brenner, John Landis, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the duties hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, they shall procure two books, and enter therein, as follows: "We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay the president and managers of the Manor turnpike road company, the sum of fifty dollars for every share of stock subscribed by us, in such manner and proportions, and at such times and places as shall be determined on by the said president and managers, in pursuance of an act authorizing the governor to incorporate the
