AN ACT

Authorizing a Temporary Loan.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized to negotiate a temporary loan, on the credit of the commonwealth, not exceeding seventy-five thousand dollars, at an interest not exceeding five per centum per annum, with any bank or banks, corporation, individual or individuals, as in his opinion may be most advantageous; and the sum or sums thus borrowed, shall be applied to meet the current expenses of the treasury; the money borrowed, by virtue of this act, shall be paid to the lender or lenders, within ninety days from the date of this act, and authority is hereby given to the governor, to make such payment out of any money then in the treasury.

AN ACT

To provide for the election of three supervisors, in the township of Franklin, Fayette county; and for the election of constables, in the township of Connellsville; and for the election of constables in Somerset county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the electors of Franklin township, in Fayette county, to elect annually, at their usual

place of electing township officers, three qualified citizens, for supervisors of the roads for said township, subject to the same rules and regulations, as supervisors are by law now regulated.

SECTION 2. That so much of the fifth section of the act of the twenty-eighth March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, as prevents a person from serving as constable for more than two years, in any term of three years, and so much of any other law or laws of this commonwealth, as limits the eligibility of the same person to the office of constable, to any certain number of years, be and the same are hereby repealed, so far as they relate to the township of Connellsville, in the county of Fayette.

SECTION 3. That so much of the fifth section of the act of the twenty-eighth of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, as prevents a person from serving as constable, for more than two years, in every term of three years, and so much of any other law or laws of this commonwealth, as limits the eligibility of the same person to the office of constable, to any certain number of years, be and the same are hereby repealed, so far as they relate to the county of Somerset.
