AN ACT

Empowering the Lutheran Congregation of the old Goshenhoppen church, in Upper Salford township, in Montgomery county, to collect their outstanding debts.

Preamble

WHEREAS, The Lutheran congregation of the old Goshenhoppen church, in Upper Salford township, Montgomery county, have some funds to collect, and not being incorporated, it became necessary for the proper management of the temporal concerns thereof, to have an act passed authorizing the aforesaid congregation to perform the duties relating to the office of treasurer, and to collect all funds belonging unto the same; Therefore,

Treasurer authorized to receive in trust funds, &c.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That any treasurer regularly elected by a majority of the members of the aforesaid Lutheran congregation of the old Goshenhoppen church, in the township of Upper Salford and county of Montgomery, from and after the passage of this act, be and is hereby authorized to receive in trust, and collect all such funds belonging unto the congregation aforesaid, as may be required and in such manner as may be deemed necessary, for the proper use and benefit of the said congregation, and he shall pay out the whole amount or such part thereof, and to such person or persons, as the order signed by the president, and attested by the secretary of the aforesaid congregation, when presented to him, may demand.

To pay out on order signed by president

To be responsible, keep correct accounts, submit the same for investigation, &c.

SECTION 2. That any treasurer elected as aforesaid, shall secure and be responsible for all funds entrusted to him for safe keeping for, and by the congregation aforesaid, and keep a correct account of the same; and he shall submit the account to investigation, whenever thereunto required by a majority of the vestrymen or the congregation, and he shall obligate himself for the true payment of the whole amount entrusted to his care, if and when required by the congregation.

In case of death, &c. of treasurer, vacancy how supplied

SECTION 3. That in case of death, resignation or removal of the treasurer, it shall be the duty of the vestrymen immediately, if necessary to appoint one of their number as acting treasurer pro tem. until a new treasurer be regularly elected, who shall remain in office until his place be supplied by a successor, and that the treasurer for the time being, shall dis-

charge the whole amount in his possession, whenever there-
unto required by the congregation aforesaid.

SECTION 4. That Jacob H. Reif, John De Turk and Solo-^{Directors of}
mon High, shall continue to act as directors of the Moravian^{the Moravian}
