AN ACT

To authorize the Governor to incorporate the president, managers, and
company, of the Centreville and Donegal Clay Turnpike Road com-
pany, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of*
Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in
General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the
authority of the same, That George Hice, (of William,) and ^{Com'issioners}
Edward Riley, of Indiana county, and Paul Clark, William
Huston, John Moorhead, John Clifford, Noah Mendell,
Robert Graham, S. P. Cummins, Henry Marker, Kelian
Ambrose, John Campbell, and John Gay, of Westmoreland
county be, and are hereby appointed commissioners to do
and perform the several things hereinafter mentioned, that is to
say, they shall, on or before the first day of June next, pro- ^{To procure}

Notice	one thousand eight hundred and _____, and shall thereupon give notice in one or more of the newspapers, printed in the counties of Indiana and Westmoreland, for one month, of the time and place, when and where the said book shall be opened to receive subscriptions for the stock of the said company, at which time and place some one of the said commissioners shall attend, and permit and suffer all persons of lawful age, who shall offer to subscribe in the said book, in their own name, or in the name of any other person who shall duly authorize the same, for any number of shares of the said stock; and the said book shall be kept open, respectively, for the purpose aforesaid, for at least six hours in every juridical day, for the space of three days, and until the said book, so opened, shall have two hundred shares therein subscribed, and if at the expiration of the said three days, the book aforesaid shall not have the number of shares aforesaid therein subscribed, the said commissioners, respectively, may adjourn from time to time, and transfer the book from place to place, until the whole number of shares shall be subscribed, of which adjournment and transfer, the said commissioners shall give notice as the occasion may require.

Whenever ten or more persons shall have subscribed fifty shares or more of the said stock, the commissioners shall certify, under their hands and seals, the names of the subscribers, and the number of shares subscribed by each to the governor; and thereupon, it shall and may be lawful for the governor, by letters patent, under his hand and the seal of the state, to create and erect the subscribers, and if the said subscriptions be not full at the time, then also those who shall afterwards subscribe to the number aforesaid, into one body, corporate and politic, by the name, style, and title of "the president, managers, and company, of the Centreville and Donegal clay turnpike road," and by the said name the said subscribers shall have perpetual succession, and all the privileges and franchises incident to a corporation, and shall be capable of taking and holding their said capital stock, and the increase and profits thereof, and of enlarging the same, from time to time, by new subscriptions, in such manner and

form as they shall think proper, if such enlargement shall be found necessary to fulfil the intent and meaning of this act, and of purchasing, taking, and holding to them, and their successors and assigns, and of selling, transferring and conveying in fee simple, or for any less estate, all such lands, tenements, hereditaments, and estates, real and personal, as shall be necessary to them in the prosecution of their works, and of suing, and being sued, and doing all and every other matter and thing, which a corporation or body politic may lawfully do.

SECTION 3. The commissioners aforesaid, as soon as conveniently may be, after the said letters patent shall be sealed and obtained, shall give notice in the public papers aforesaid, of the time and place by them to be appointed, not less than thirty days from the publication of the first notice, of what time and place, the said subscribers shall proceed to organize the said corporation, and shall choose by a majority of votes of their own subscribers, by ballot, to be delivered in person, or by proxy, duly authorized, one president, five managers, one treasurer, and such other officers as they shall think necessary to conduct the business of the said company for one year, and until such other officers shall be chosen; and the said managers so chosen, and their successors, shall, and may make such by-laws, rules, and regulations, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state, and of the United States, as shall be necessary for the well ordering of the affairs of the said company.

SECTION 4. That the said president and managers, their superintendents, surveyors, engineers, and agents, shall be, and they are hereby authorized to enter in and upon all inclosures, over or through which the said road shall pass, or that it shall be thought proper to pass over, and the same to examine, and thereon shall locate a road, according to the best of their judgment, beginning at the town of Cenreville, in the county of Indiana, thence by the way of Ligoneer to Donegaltown, in the county of Westmoreland, which said road shall be opened forty feet wide, at least twenty feet of which shall be made an artificial road, of clay, stone, or gravel, or such other materials as the president and managers shall think proper, so that the same, when completed, shall not exceed in ascent or descent five degrees from a horizontal line, and when said road shall be completed, shall forever be a free road: *Provided*, The owners of land through which the said road shall pass, shall have the same remedy for damages, as is provided in the general road laws of this commonwealth: *And provided further*, That the said president and managers, in locating said road, shall select the nearest route, and the best ground, between the several points

Nearest and best route, &c designated, doing, at the same time, as little damage to the property of private individuals, as may be consistent with the judicious location of said road. And the election of president and managers shall be held annually after the first election, on the first Monday in April, of each and every year.

Road to be kept in repair SECTION 5. That the said road shall be kept in repair, as public roads now are, which are laid out by order of courts of general quarter sessions of the peace, agreeably to the several acts of assembly, in such cases made and provided.

Joseph Pumroy, Wm. C. Lyon, of Franklin co. Abm. Long of Huntingdon county, appointed commissioners SECTION 6. That William S. Lyon, Joseph Pumroy, of Concord, Franklin county, and Abraham Long, of Huntingdon county, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to view, lay out, and mark a state road from Shippenburg, in Cumberland county, by the way of Roxbury, in Franklin county, Amberson's Valley, Concord, near Pollard's farm, in Blacklog Valley, at or near Bell's mill, to the Pennsylvania canal, at or near Drake's ferry.

Duty of commissioners SECTION 7. It shall be the duty of the said commissioners, or a majority of them, (after having been sworn or affirmed before some justice of the peace, who shall file and preserve the same in his office, to perform the duties enjoined on them by this act, with impartiality and fidelity,) carefully to view

To be sworn the ground over which the road laid out by them may pass, and lay out the same on the most suitable and proper ground, and that they shall clearly and distinctly mark upon the ground the route agreed upon; and for the purpose of fulfilling the duties in this act enjoined, the commissioners herein mentioned shall receive one dollar and fifty cents for every day they shall be necessarily employed in performing their duties under this act, and the said commissioners are authorized to employ one surveyor, at two dollars per day, two chain bearers, and one axeman, at a per diem allowance not exceeding one dollar.

Draft of road, courses and distances To be deposited in Secretary's office And in office of clerk of session SECTION 8. It shall be the duty of the said commissioners to make out a fair and accurate draft of the location of said road, noting thereon the courses and distances, as they occur, the improvements passed through, and also the crossing of county and township lines, roads, and waters, with such other matters as may serve for explanation, one copy whereof shall be deposited in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth, on or before the first day of January next, and one copy in the office of the clerk of the court of quarter sessions of the respective counties, through which said road may pass, on the day aforesaid, or as much sooner as practicable, which shall be a record thereof.

Accounts, &c SECTION 9. The accounts of the said commissioners for their own pay, and for the pay of surveyors, chain carriers, and markers, shall be adjusted by the commissioners of the

respective counties, through which said road shall pass, and paid by the treasurers thereof, on warrants drawn in the usual way, in proportion to the length of the road in such county respectively.

SECTION 10. The said commissioners shall meet on or before the first Monday in June next, or as soon thereafter as practicable, at such places as a majority of them shall agree upon, and complete the location of said road as soon as practicable; and if any vacancy or vacancies shall happen by resignation, or any other cause, the court of quarter sessions of the proper county, as the case may be, are hereby authorized to fill the vacancy or vacancies by a suitable appointment.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled An act to provide for repairs and continue the improvements of the state, and for other purposes, passed the fourteenth of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners are hereby authorized and required to examine the location of the outlet lock at Duncan's island, and to change the said location, if in their opinion the interests of the state require it; and if in their opinion the object of the construction of said lock and the interests of the commonwealth could be better advanced by the erection of a bridge over the Juniata, at or near its mouth, then the sum of ten thousand dollars appropriated for the construction of said lock, by the act of the fourteenth of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, shall be
