SUPPLEMENT

To the act incorporating the Buck Mountain Coal Company, passed on the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the time for completing the rail road of the Buck Mountain coal company, is hereby extended for three years, from the sixteenth day of June next, and that the said company be, and they are hereby authorized to extend their location of land, into the county of Northampton, *Provided,* The quantity shall not exceed five hundred acres, including the land taken up by their rail road. Also, that the said company may increase their capital stock, the amount of one hundred thousand dollars, for the sole purpose

AN ACT

Granting to the trustees under the will of James Lyle, further powers.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That John B. Newman, Hartman

Executors and trustees to invest personal property in erecting buildings, &c.

Kuhn and Henry Beckett, executors and trustees named in the will of James Lyle, deceased, and the survivors and survivor of them be, and they are hereby authorized to invest any part of the personal property belonging to their trusts in the erection of suitable buildings upon any of the vacant lots belonging to the same, or in building or re-building suitable houses or buildings in the place, or in improvement of such as have become decayed or delapidated or are otherwise unfit for profitable use in their present condition, and are hereby also authorized to re-sell and convey any real estate which they have heretofore purchased, or may hereafter purchase by virtue of their present powers, and that all such investments of sales shall be for the account of the cestui que trusts of that moiety of the estate to which the proceeds invested, or the real estate sold belonged before such investment or re-sale. *Provided,* That said executors and trustees, before such sale or application of moneys, shall give bond with sufficient surety, in such form and such sum, as the orphans' court of said county, in which the property lies, may order and direct, for the faithful execution of the power hereby committed to them, and for the pro-
