AN ACT

Granting to the trustees under the will of James Lyle, further powers.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That John B. Newman, Hartman

Executors and trustees to invest personal property in erecting buildings, &c.

Kuhn and Henry Beckett, executors and trustees named in the will of James Lyle, deceased, and the survivors and survivor of them be, and they are hereby authorized to invest any part

of the personal property belonging to their trusts in the erection of suitable buildings upon any of the vacant lots belonging to the same, or in building or re-building suitable houses or buildings in the place, or in improvement of such as have become decayed or delapidated or are otherwise unfit for profitable

use in their present condition, and are hereby also authorized to re-sell and convey any real estate which they have heretofore purchased, or may hereafter purchase by virtue of their present powers, and that all such investments of sales shall be for the account of the cestui que trusts of that moiety of the estate

AN ACT

To incorporate the Shrewsbury Rail Road company, in the county of York.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That James Gerry, Robert Richey, Henry Latimer, John Hershner, Isaac Koller, John Beck, junior, Robert Fife, Andrew Gordan, Joseph Jordau, Archibald Thompson, Adam Ebaugh, James Wallace, or any six of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several things herein after mentioned, that is to say, they shall on or before the first day of July next, procure a book which shall be opened at the borough of Shrewsbury, in which they shall enter as follows: "We whose names are hereunto subscribed do promise to pay to the president and directors of the Shrewsbury rail road company, the sum of twenty-five dollars, for each share of stock set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and in such proportions and at such times, as shall be determined by the president and directors of said company, in pursuance of an act to incorporate the Shrewsbury rail road company. Witness our hands the day of in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and ;" and shall thereupon give notice in one or more newspapers printed in the county of York, two weeks at least of the time when the said book shall be opened to receive subscriptions for the stock of said company, at which time and place, one or more of the commissioners shall attend and permit all persons of lawful
