

a quorum of the board of trustees, such degrees in the arts, sciences, and other branches thereof, to such pupils of the seminary, and others who by their proficiency in learning, or other distinction, they think shall be entitled to them, as have been usually granted in other similar seminaries, or, which the said trustees, or a quorum thereof, shall think right and proper, and to grant to such graduates, certificates under their common seal.

SECTION 5. Persons of every religious denomination shall be capable of being elected trustees, nor shall any person either as principal, teacher, tutor, or pupil, be refused admittance into the seminary, or be denied any of the privileges, immunities, or advantages thereof, for, or on account of his or her sentiments in matters of religion. Who may be trustees

SECTION 6. No misnomer of said corporation shall defeat or annul any gift, grant, devise, or bequest, to or from said corporation. *Provided*, That the intent of the parties shall sufficiently appear upon the face of the gift, grant, will, or other writing, whereby any estate or interest was intended to pass to, or from said corporation. Misnomer not to annul gift

SECTION 7. The legislature reserves the right to revoke, alter, or annul the charter hereby granted at any time they may think proper. Legislature may annul

AN ACT

To increase the number of Jurors in the county of Union.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of any former acts of assembly, as limits the number of traverse jurors to be summoned for the courts of common pleas and quarter sessions of Union county, to thirty-six, be, and the same is hereby repealed. Act limiting the number of jurors repealed

ed, and that the number of jurors hereafter to be summoned in said county, be the same as authorized by the ninety-ninth section of the act of the fourteenth of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, entitled "An act relative to the organization of courts of justice," for the courts of common pleas and quarter sessions of the other counties of this commonwealth, excepting the common pleas or district court of the county of Philadelphia, or in the supreme court at bar or at nisi prius.

AN ACT

To exempt the real estate of the Philadelphia Dispensary from taxation.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the real estate belonging to, and held and used by the Philadelphia Dispensary, be, and the same hereby is exempted from all state, county, corporation, poor, and school taxes so long as the said real estate shall be used for the purposes of said dispensary.
