AN ACT

Changing the time of holding the August term of the courts, in the county of Wayne, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the term of the courts in the county of Wayne, which at present commences on the third Monday of August, be and the same is hereby changed hereafter to commence and be held in and for said county of Wayne, on the second Monday, after the August term in the county of Pike, and all recognizances which have been or shall be entered into returnable to April or August terms of said county, be and the same are hereby extended to and made returnable on the said second Monday after the August term in the county of Pike.

SECTION 2. That so much of the act of the seventh day of May, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, as authorizes the governor to incorporate a company for making a turnpike road from Honesdale, to the Delaware river, at or near the mouth of the Great Equinunk creek in Wayne county, be and the same hereby is revived and re-enacted, and the said company is hereby allowed the further period of five years for commencing the work and ten years for completing the said turnpike road, from the passing of this act, any thing in the said act contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

SECTION 3. Homer Brooks and Thomas S. Holmes, are hereby appointed commissioners to carry the said act into effect in place of Thomas T. Hayes and Alexander Calder, removed.

WHEREAS, it is represented that the grand jury of York county, in November, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, recommended a grant of one thousand dollars out of the county funds, towards the erection of a bridge over the Conewago creek: That on the faith of this recommendation, a few individuals of the said county borrowed the above sum from George Aughinbaugh, and gave their obligation for the same, and the said money was expended in the erection of the said bridge, and the commissioners of said county do not feel themselves justifiable in paying the said George Aughinbaugh without an act of assembly:

Preamble

Therefore, be it enacted.

SECTION 4. That the commissioners of York county, be authorized to ascertain whether the said sum of one thousand dollars borrowed from said George Aughinbaugh, was obtained for the use of the county, and by reason of any arrangement or contract with the commissioners thereof, and expended in the erection of the said bridge, and if so borrowed and expended, and they believe the county is equitably indebted for the same, that they be authorized to draw an order on the treasurer of York county, for the payment of said sum with lawful interest, if under all the circumstances, the county of York is in equity bound to pay interest thereon.

AN ACT

Authorizing the sale of the real estate of Abraham Bare, late of Chester county, deceased.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the grant of the Register of Wills &c. of the county of Chester, on the eighteenth day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, of administration of the goods and chattles, rights and credits which were of Abraham Bare, late of the township of Coventry, in said county, deceased, to Abraham R. Bare and David Strunk, be and the same is hereby declared valid and effectual to all intents and purposes, whatsoever, as if the said Abraham Bare had died intestate.

SECTION 2. That the proceedings in the Orphans' Court of said county of Chester, in relation to the partition and valuation of the real estate of the said Abraham Bare, and the several orders, rules and decrees of the said court, touching
