AN ACT

To authorize the Governor to subscribe for stock to the companies for erecting bridges over the river Susquehanna, at the towns of Danville and Northumberland.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the governor of this commonwealth is hereby authorized and required to subscribe for two hundred shares in the stock of the company for erecting a bridge over the river Susquehanna at the town of Danville, to be expended in procuring the necessary materials, and towards making the repairs to the said bridge.

SECTION 2. That the governor of this commonwealth, is hereby authorized and required to subscribe ten thousand dollars, to the stock of the Northumberland bridge company, to be expended in procuring the necessary materials for rebuilding the bridge across the North Branch of the river Susquehanna, at the town of Northumberland, in the county of Northumberland.

SECTION 3. The canal commissioners are hereby directed to cause an estimate to be made, of the entire costs of repairing each of said bridges, in a permanent and substantial

manner, and to make report thereof to the legislature, on or before the fifteenth day of May next; and the governor is hereby authorized, to draw his warrant on the state treasurer for the amount of the above subscriptions, to be paid out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated.

AN ACT

To revive and amend an act, entitled "An act to authorize the Sandy and Beaver canal company, to extend a canal into Pennsylvania, passed the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight"

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all the provisions of the act entitled "an act to authorize the Sandy and Beaver canal company, to extend a canal into Pennsylvania," passed the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, be, and the same are hereby revived, and continued in full force, subject to the limitations and amendments hereinafter set forth

SECTION 2. That the said canal company are hereby authorized and empowered, to make an outlet lock, or locks, into the river Ohio, at the termination of the said canal, and at, or near the mouth of the Little Beaver creek in the state of Pennsylvania, and so much of the said act, to extend the Sandy and Beaver canal into Pennsylvania, as requires the said canal company to continue the canal from a point, at or near the mouth of Little Beaver creek, up the valley of the Ohio to the vicinity of the mouth of the Big Beaver creek be and the same is hereby repealed. *Provided,* That nothing contained in this act shall be construed to prevent the state of Pennsyl-
