AN ACT

For the relief of Adam Kenar, and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian Wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Adam Kenar, of York county, John Andrews, of Warren county, Jacob Gideon, of Washington county, James Watson, of Allegheny county, Elizabeth Overturff, of Fayette county, Susanna Kettleman, of Berks county, Mary Levering, of Philadelphia county, Mary Campbell, of Chester county, and Mary Williamson, of Mercer county, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately as a gratuity and an annuity of forty dollars annually during life, payable half yearly to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine. The aforesaid gratuities and annuities, to be paid in conformity with the existing laws.

SECTION 2. The state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to the heirs and legal representatives of James Campbell, a lieutenant in the Pennsylvania line during the revolutionary war, or to their order or assigns, the sum of two hundred dollars as full compensation for a tract of donation land situate in the tenth district, being number two thousand one hundred and forty-nine, granted to said James Campbell, by patent, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, and which said tract it appears on reference to the draughts on file in the land office, lays within the state of New-York.

SECTION 3. That so much of the fifth section of the act of twenty seventh day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, entitled an act for the relief of Conrad Hurtz, and others, soldiers, and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and

Indian wars, as gives a pension to Henry Gordon, of Mercer county, be, and the same is hereby repealed, the name of the person intended by said act, being Henry Jordon of the county aforesaid, and the pension granted by said act to said Henry Gordon, be, and the same is hereby granted to Henry Jordon of the county aforesaid, and the payments of pension heretofore made by the treasurer of Mercer county to said Henry Gordon under the act aforesaid, shall be allowed and settled as other payments of the same kind are settled and allowed.

SECTION 6. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Margaret Dimm, of Lycoming county, or to her order, forty dollars immediately as a gratuity in full, for services rendered by her husband in the revolutionary war.

AN ACT

Relating to the trial of Bemis and others, in York county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That upon the voluntary surrender of Nathan S. Bemis, Jacob Forwood, Edward Prigg, and Stephen Lewis, or either of them, to the court of quarter sessions of the peace, for the county of York, to answer unto certain bills of indictment for kidnapping, now depending against them in said court, the judges of said court shall and may, and are hereby authorized and directed to take the several recognizances of the said parties, or of either of them so surrendering, as aforesaid, in the penalty of one thousand dollars each, conditioned for his appearance to answer unto said indictments, and to abide by such final decision in the premises, as shall be had and made in the manner hereinafter provided for.
