AN ACT

To incorporate "The Good Spring Creek Coal Company."

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Adam Diller, Peter Fritz, Francis B. Nichols, T. M. Moor, Samuel Humes, Christian Bachman, Thomas E. Franklin, John K. Findlay, Henry Buehler, William J. Leiper, Robert Smithhurst, John B. Puh, Joseph B. Anthony, John A. Gamble, their associates, successors, and assigns, be and they are hereby instituted a body politic and corporate, by the name, style, and title of "The Good Spring Creek Coal company," with a capital of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, divided into two thousand five hundred shares, of one hundred dollars each; and the company may hold, not exceeding two thousand acres of land, in Lower Mahantongo township, Schuylkill county, and shall have power and authority to construct a rail-road or rail-roads, from any point in the said lands; to connect with the Wisconisco canal, or Union canal, or any other of the public improvements, or with any other rail-road leading to said improvements; and that the said company, hereby incorporated, shall possess and enjoy all the powers, privileges, and immunities, and be subject to the restrictions, terms, and conditions, so far as the same may be applicable, contained in the act entitled "An act to incorporate the Plymouth Coal company," certified to have become a law on the*

sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, and in the first, second, third, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, and twelfth sections of said law: *Provided*, That the acts and things directed by said sections to be done, and situate in the county of Luzerne, shall be done and situate in Schuylkill and Dauphin counties: *And provided further*, That said company shall have power to borrow any sum of money, not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars, and convert the same into certificates of capital stock, if the same shall be found actually necessary to complete the improvements connected herewith; only one hundred thousand dollars of said capital stock to be employed in the mining of coal, and transporting the same to market; the balance to be exclusively employed in the construction of the said rail-road or rail-roads.

SECTION 2. This act shall be and continue in force until the first day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine: *Provided*, That it shall be lawful for the legislature at any time to amend or repeal any of the foregoing provisions, and to rescind the powers whenever they think proper, in such manner, however, that no injustice shall be done to the corporators: *And provided further*, That this act shall cease to be in force, unless some one of the rail-roads, authorized by this act, shall be commenced within three years, and completed within seven years from the passage of this act.
