

of trial shall be pursued in Adams county, that would by law have been pursued in York county, and the prothonotary of the court of common pleas of York county shall at the request of any person or persons interested, certify to the court of common pleas of Adams county, any record or records, mechanics lien, entry, or other proceedings heretofore had, made, or entered, or hereafter to be had, made, or entered, in York county, in relation to said debts, contracts, claims, mechanics liens, appeals, and demands, and the Prothonotary of the county of Adams, shall enter the same of record, and the same proceeding may be had thereon in Adams county, that otherwise might have been had in York county, and with the like effect. And the sheriff of Adams county shall serve all necessary process under this act in the county of York, in the same manner, and with like effect as the sheriff of York county might have done, except original process which shall be executed by the sheriff of York county, and suits on said debts, contracts, claims, or demands, may hereafter be brought in the county of York, and removed for trial as aforesaid to the county of Adams.

## AN ACT

To aid the Pennsylvania and Ohio Canal Company.

Governor to  
subscribe  
\$50,000

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the governor is hereby authorized and required to subscribe to the stock of the Pennsylvania and Ohio Canal Company, the sum of fifty thousand dollars, which shall constitute the commonwealth a stockholder in said company to that amount, on equal footing with other stockholders of said company.

SECTION 2. Said subscription of stock shall be made subject to the following conditions. That the said Pennsylvania and Ohio Canal Company, shall during the present year, erect farm bridges over that part of the line of canal within the state of Pennsylvania, of such plans as a majority of the board of Commissioners appointed by the laws of this state, to assess damages, shall designate in their award, unless said company shall procure a written release from the obligation to build such bridge, from the person for whose accommodation said bridge was awarded, or it shall be lawful for said company to compromise with any individual whose real property
