AN ACT

To incorporate the "Union Railroad and Mining Company."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That James Peacock, Joseph Black,

Henry Beader, Samuel H. Clark, O. Barrett, E. Guyer, and E. F. Pennypacker, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name, style and title, of the "Union Railroad and Mining Company," with a capital of three hundred thousand dollars, divided into three thousand shares of one hundred dollars each; and the said company may hold not exceeding two thousand acres of land, in Dauphin and Schuyl-

kill counties, and shall have power and authority to construct a railroad or railroads, from any point in the said lands, to connect with any of the Pennsylvania improvements, or with any railroad leading to said improvements. And that the said company hereby incorporated, shall possess and enjoy, all the powers, privileges and immunities, and be subject to the restrictions and conditions, so far as the same may be applicable, contained in the act entitled, "An act to incorporate the Plymouth Coal Company," certified to have become a law on the sixteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, and in the first

second, third, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, and twelfth, sections of said law. *Provided*, That the acts and things directed by said sections to be done, and situated in the county of Luzerne, shall be done and situated in Dauphin and Schuylkill counties. *And provided further*, That said company shall have power to borrow any sum not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, and convert the same into certificates of capital stock, if the same shall be deemed necessary. Only two hundred thousand dollars issued, capital stock, to be employed in the mining of coal, and transporting the same to market, the balance to be exclusively employed in the construction of the necessary railroads and other improvements.

SECTION 2. This act shall be and continue in force until the first day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine. *Provided*, That it shall be lawful for the legislature, at any time, to amend or repeal any of the foregoing provisions, and to rescind any of the powers hereby granted. *And provided further*, That this act shall cease to be in force, unless some railroad contemplated by this act, shall be commenced within three years and completed within seven years, from the passage of this act.

AN ACT

For the better preservation of certain species of Game in the county of Adams and Dauphin.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That from and after the first day of April next, no person shall kill in the counties of Adams and Dauphin, any woodcock, between the first day of February and the twentieth day of June; nor any wild turkey, pheasant, &c. within certain periods
