AN ACT

To incorporate "The Chambersburg Northern Fire Company."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every the persons who shall, at the time of passing this act, be members of the association ^{Incorporated} called the Chambersburg Northern Fire company, in Chambersburg, shall be and they are hereby created and declared to be one body politic and corporate, by the name, style, and title of "The Chambersburg Northern Fire company," ^{Name style and title} and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, in all courts of record, or elsewhere; and also the said corporation and their successors, at all times hereafter, be able ^{Corporate powers} to purchase, receive, have, and hold, and enjoy to them and their successors, all, and all manner of lands, tenements, rents, annuities, liberties, franchises, and other hereditaments, goods, and chattels, of what nature, kind, or quality, soever, real, personal, or mixed, or choses in action, and the same from time to time, to sell, grant, demise, alien, and dispose of: ^{Provided} That the clear yearly value or income of the said corporation shall not exceed thirteen hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-three cents; and also to make, and have, a common seal, and the same to break and renew at pleasure: ^{Of seal by-} and also to ordain, establish, and put in execution such by- ^{laws ordina-} laws, ordinances, and regulations, as shall appear necessary ^{ces &c.} and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to the constitution and laws of the United States, or of this commonwealth, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which to them shall lawfully appertain to do, for the well being of the said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof.

SECTION 2. Nothing in this act contained shall be deemed to authorize the said company to engage either directly or ^{Banking pro-} indirectly in any banking, monied, commercial, or manufac- ^{hibited} turing concern, or to act in any other way than as a fire company.

SECTION 3. The legislature reserves the power to alter, revoke, or annul the privileges and charter hereby granted, ^{Right to re-} whenever, in their opinion, the same may be injurious to the peal

citizens of the commonwealth, in such manner, however, that no injustice shall be done to the corporators.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled a supplement to an act for the sale of certain Islands in the river Susquehanna, passed the twenty-fifth of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty.

Act extending
for one year

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the provisions of the act, entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the sale of certain islands in the river Susquehanna, passed twenty-fifth of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, be extended for the term of one year from the passage of this act, and that the price of the vacant part of said island be reduced so as not to be less than one dollar per acre.
