## AN ACT

To incorporate the Morris Run Coal Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Samuel W. Morris, Jacob Hains, Charles Ellis, Edward Coleman, Lewis Saynisch, Joseph P. Morris, and their associates, successors, and assigns, be, and they are hereby constituted a body politic, and corporate, by the name, style and title of the Morris Run coal company, and the said company shall possess and enjoy all the powers, privileges and immunities, and be subject to the restrictions, terms and conditions, provided in an act, entitled "an act to incorporate the Hazleton coal company, passed the eighteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six." *Provided,* That the lands of said company shall not exceed two thousand acres, and shall lie in Covington township, Tioga county, and shall not consist of more than two distinct bodies, and the capital stock of said company shall not exceed one hundred and fifty thousand dollars. *Provided,* That the said company shall make an annual return, on the oath of the president or secretary of said company, of the amount of the dividends, and they shall pay into the state treasury a tax of eight per cent on all dividends, when they shall declare dividends exceeding eight per cent per annum. *Provided also,* That the company hereby incorporated, shall have power to construct a rail road, not exceeding seven miles in length, with one or more tracks from any point on their lands, to intersect the rail road of the "Tioga navigation company, at such place as they may deem most convenient, and for that purpose, they may increase their capital stock or borrow one hundred thousand dollars, and with the like privileges, restrictions and conditions, as are provided by "an act entitled a further supplement to an act, entitled an act authorizing the Governor to incorporate the "Tioga navigation company, passed the fourth day of April A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three. *Provided also,* that said company shall not take the property of any individual, for the construction of said rail road, without making compensation to

A N A C T

To incorporate the Bellefonte Female Seminary, in the Borough of Bellefonte, in the county of Centre.

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That there shall be, and is hereby established in the borough of Bellefonte, in the county of Centre, a female seminary, or public school, for the education of female youth, in the English and other languages and in the useful arts, sciences and literature, by the name, style, and title of the Bellefonte female seminary, the said seminary to be under the management, direction and government of a board of trustees not exceeding five in number, three of whom shall be a quorum to transact business. The trustees are the following named persons : Hugh N. M'Allister, James Burnside, Andrew G. Curton, James P. Gregg, and Robert Hays, which said trustees and their successors, to be elected as hereinafter mentioned, shall be, and they are hereby erected, established, and declared to be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and with all the incidents of a corporation, in deed and in law, to all intents and purposes whatsoever, by the name, style and title of "The Trustees of the Bellefonte Female Seminary" by which name, and title the said trustees and their successors, shall be able and capable at law and in equity, to take to themselves and their successors, for the use of said seminary, any estate in any messuages, lands, tenements, hereditaments, goods, chattels, moneys or other effects, by gift, grant, bargain, sale, conveyance, assurance, will, devise or bequest of any person
