AN ACT

For the relief of William Mooreland, and others soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian Wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer, be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to William Mooreland, and Ann Smith, of Westmoreland county, Michael Rodgers, Susanna Phillipe, and Julianna Siegendaler, of Berks county, John Chambers, of Butler county, Nathaniel Bailey, Thomas Jones, and Catharine Wertz, of York county, Sarah Stanart, city of Philadelphia, Catharine Gehr, of Crawford county, Isabella Couler, of Portage county, state of Ohio, Anna Maria Behny, of Lebanon county, soldiers and widows of soldiers, of the revolutionary and Indian war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars annually, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.

SECTION 2. That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Magdalena Moore, of Lebanon county, or to her order forty dollars immediately, as a gratuity, in full for military services rendered by her late husband during the revolutionary war, the aforesaid gratuities, and annuities, to be paid in conformity with the existing laws.

SECTION 3. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to William Maple, and John Slater, of Greene county, Thomas Baird, and William Hood, of Erie county, William Hollingshead, of Bedford county, John Stewart of Indiana county, William Sutton, George Potts, and John Farr, of Fayette county, George Lightener, James Moore, Philip Mason, and Jacob Yoho, of Beaver county, Frederick Tressla, of Franklin county, William Baggs, and John Shroders, of Allegheny county, Joseph Peden, of Washington county, soldiers, and Mary Shochey, of Somerset county, Elizabeth Shaback, of Lancaster county, Adah Anderson, of Armstrong county, Jane M'Laughlin, of Beaver county, Ann Butler, of Philadelphia city, and Mary Ann Latimore, of Erie county, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders,

forty dollars immediately as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine.

SECTION 4. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to James Kelly, of Indiana county, John Russel, of Armstrong county, Abraham Leisure, of Butler county, Job Peden, of Indiana county, Robert Riddle, of Butler county, Godfrey Klinedinst, of York county, William M'Greary, of Butler county, Philip Stone, of Northampton County, soldiers, and Ann Duff, of Butler county, widow of a soldier of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars as a gratuity in full for their military services. The foregoing gratuities and annuities to be paid in conformity to the existing laws regulating pensions.

SECTION 5. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Cooper, Monroe county, Christopher Burket, Somerset county, soldiers, and Mary Armstrong, Fayette county, Margaret Vanauken, Monroe county, and Mary Snyder, Westmoreland county, Elizabeth Overfield Monroe county, Elizabeth Jamison, of Westmoreland county, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.

SECTION 6. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to William Dawson, and Edward Morris, of Lancaster county, heirs at law of John Morris, a soldier of the revolutionary war, deceased, or their order, two hundred dollars in full compensation for a tract of donation land, to which the said John Morris, was entitled for services rendered by him in said war.
