## AN ACT

To compensate Samuel Dale for services rendered as an Associate Judge of Lancaster county, and for other purposes.

Preamble-

WHEREAS, The courts of common pleas, orphans court, oyer and terminer, and general quarter sessions of the peace, of Lancaster county, were for a considerable length of time without a president judge, and during that time the duties generally performed by a president judge, were discharged by Samuel Dale; therefore, for the purpose of making a just remuneration to the said Samuel Dale for his said services,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of five hundred dollars be, and is hereby, granted to the said Samuel Dale, to be paid to him by the state treasurer, as a compensation for all extra services rendered by him as an associate judge of the several courts of Lancaster county, during the period when the said courts were without a president judge, and while he was discharging the duties generally appertaining to a president judge.

SECTION 2. That the second section of the act of the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, which authorizes the president judge of the sixteenth judicial district to hold special courts in Clearfield county, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. That the provisions of the first section of the act, entitled an act taxing certain offices, passed on the tenth day of March, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and ten, relative to the charge against prothonotaries of the several courts of this commonwealth, shall not be applied to the prothonotary of the district court for the city and county of Philadelphia, until after the necessary expenses of the office of said prothonotary shall have been deducted. *Provided,* That the judges of the said court shall, from time to time, direct what expenses are necessary and proper to be incurred by him for the despatch of business, and for the security of the records and other papers deposited or remaining in the said office.

## A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled, "An act to incorporate the Washington Coal Company, and for other purposes."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Pennsylvania coal company, incorporated in pursuance of an act of the general assembly, passed the sixteenth day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, be and they are hereby authorized to hold lands in the townships of Lackawanna, Plymouth, Nescopeck and Providence, in the county of Luzerne, as fully as if the said townships of Lackawanna and Providence had been embraced in the act to which this is a supplement, and that the said company be and they are hereby authorized
