A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled, "A resolution relative to the removal of a certain indictment in Bucks county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all civil-suits now pending or which may hereafter be brought, by any person whatever, against Thomas Mitchell, Stephen H. Tyng, Jacob Lex and Andrew D. Cash, or any of them, in the court of common pleas of Bucks county, arising out of or connected with the affairs of the Bristol college, shall be heard, tried and determined, before the president judge of the third judicial district, in a special court to be by him holden for that purpose in the county of Bucks, at such time as the said president judge shall fix and direct, and the said judge shall also hear and decide all interlocutory motions on such causes; as well the legality or proper service of process as otherwise. The said causes shall be tried by a jury to be drawn by the sheriff of the county of Chester, upon a venire, to be directed to the said sheriff by the president judge of the third judicial district, commanding him to draw from the wheel, containing the names of the persons selected according to law to be

jurors in his bailiwick, the names of thirty-six persons, and to transmit a list of the names so drawn to the prothonotary of the court of common pleas of the county of Bucks, at least sixty days previously to the beginning of the special term appointed for the trial of said actions, which list shall be struck at the office of the said prothonotary, on such day and at such time, as shall be fixed by the said president judge of the third judicial district, or at such times as the parties or their attorneys may agree upon, being not less than thirty days before the beginning of the said special court, each party striking six names, whereupon the said prothonotary shall issue a venire, directed to the sheriff of the said county of Chester, commanding him to summon the twenty-four persons whose names shall remain on the list, to appear at the special court so to be held for the trial of the said causes, at the time appointed for the trial thereof, and twelve of the said persons shall be empanelled to try each of the said causes, and no talesman shall be summoned or empanelled on the trial of any of the said causes, and the jurors attending shall receive the sum of one dollar and fifty cents per day for each days attendance at court, and ten cents per mile for each mile travelled in going to and returning from the same, which mileage and pay, and all the expenses of summoning and returning the said jurors, shall be paid by the commissioners of the county of Bucks, and the said causes shall be tried, and judgment and execution rendered thereon, in the same manner and with the same effect as if the same had been prosecuted in the county of Bucks, in the ordinary course of law: *Provided*, That the said Thomas Mitchell, Stephen H. Tyng, Jacob Lex and Andrew D. Cash, or either of them, shall first enter bond with sufficient security, to indemnify the county of Bucks against the payment of costs arising from such suit or suits, in case the parties aforesaid be unsuccessful, which bond shall be filed in the prothonotary's office of Bucks county.
