AN ACT

For the relief of Lorraine Christ, and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Lorraine Christ, a soldier, and to Catharine Bradley and Ellen Harkin's, of the city of Lancaster, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars annually, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand, eight hundred and thirty-nine. Gratuity and annuity to Lorraine Christ, and others, soldiers, &c.

SECTION 2. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Elizabeth Kendall of York county, Margaret Swenk of the city of Lancaster, and Magdalena Gries of Berks county, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars annually, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine. The above gratuities and annuities to be paid in conformity with the existing laws. Elizabeth Kendall, and others

SECTION 3. The state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Jacob Gideon, of Washington city, in the District of Columbia, forty dollars immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars annually, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine. And so much of the act passed on the twentieth day of May last, entitled "an act for the relief of Adam Kenar, and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars," as grants a gratuity and annuity to Jacob Gideon, of Washington county, be and the same is hereby repealed. Jacob Gideon Repeal of former act

SECTION 4. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Henry Yellis, of Montgomery county, Archibald Jameson, of Armstrong county, James Wallace, of Greene county, John Cockenbaugh, of Fayette county, Elizabeth Heimer, of Philadelphia county, Henry Yellis, and others

Elizabeth Lazarus, of Northumberland county, Isabella Himrod, of Erie county, Elizabeth Shutzer, of Washington county, in the state of Maryland, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars annually during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.

SECTION 5. That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to George Michael Blintzinger, of York county, or to his order, forty dollars, immediately, as a gratuity, in full, for his military services rendered during the revolutionary war.

Preamble WHEREAS, mistakes occurred in the place of residence of Jacob Krick, an old soldier; Therefore,

Jacob Krick, of Maryland **SECTION 6.** *Be it enacted,* That the state treasurer be directed to pay to Jacob Krick, of Washington county, in the state of Maryland, the gratuity and annuity granted to him at this session, in the same manner as if no mistake had occurred.

Preamble WHEREAS, By the tenth section of an act of assembly, passed the twenty-seventh day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, entitled "an act for the relief of Conrad Hurtz, and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, it is enacted that the state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Alexander Loury, of Armstrong county, a gratuity of forty dollars, immediately, in full, for the services performed by him in the revolutionary war: *And whereas,* A mistake occurred in said section, inasmuch as the person intended thereby was Joseph Loury, of Indiana county: *And whereas,* The same has never been paid, and the said Joseph Loury is since deceased; Therefore,

Gratuity to be paid to administrator of Joseph Loury **SECTION 7.** *Be it enacted,* That the gratuity granted to Alexander Loury, by the act passed the twenty-seventh day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, shall be immediately paid to the administrators of Joseph Loury, the person intended by said act, and who is now deceased, by the treasurer of Indiana county, in the same manner as other gratuities and pensions are now by law payable.
