## AN ACT

To incorporate the Library Company of Uniontown, in the county of Fayette.

- SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met; and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the library company of Uniontown, in the county of Fayette, is hereby enacted into one body politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "the library company of Uniontown, Pennsylvania," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, be capable of suing and being sued, to have a common seal, and the same to alter or renew at pleasure, and shall be able and capable in law and equity, to take and hold for the use of the said company, any goods and chattels, or any sum or sums of money, by gift, grant, bargain, sale, will, devise or bequest, from any person or persons, whomsoever, capable of making the same, and the same grant, bargain and sell, for the use of the library, and generally to do all and singular, the matters and things which shall be lawful for them to do, for the well being and due management of the affairs thereof.
- SECTION 2.** That this corporation shall consist of all such persons as are now members, or shall be hereafter admitted as such, agreeably to the by-laws of said company.
- SECTION 3.** That the officers of the said library company shall consist of a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, librarian and five managers. The president and vice president shall be *ex officio* managers, and the duties of the said officers shall be particularly enumerated in the by-laws of the company.
- SECTION 4.** That the officers of the company, with the exception of the librarian, shall be chosen by ballot, at a general meeting of the company, on the first Monday of February, annually, to continue in office for one year or until their successors are elected, but if such meeting should not then take place, such meeting or election shall take place as soon thereafter as may be, reasonable notice being given of the time and place; and the librarian shall be appointed as the by-laws may direct.

SECTION 5. That the funds or capital stock of the company, shall be divided into shares of five dollars each, and the members shall be entitled to one vote for each share by them held, and the said stock shall be held as personal property, and as such transferred, under such regulations as the by laws may prescribe. That the managers of said corporation or a majority of them, shall have power to make all needful rules, regulations and by-laws, for the government of the corporation and the management of its affairs. *Provided*, That such by-laws are not repugnant to nor inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state, or the United States. ## AN ACT

To incorporate the Allegheny Fire Company, of the borough of Freeport.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every the persons who shall, at the time of the passing of this act, be members of the association, called "the Allegheny fire company, of the borough of Freeport," shall be, and they are hereby created and declared to be one body politic and corporate, by the name, style, and title of "the Allegheny fire company, of the borough of Freeport," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue, and be sued, implead, and be impleaded, in all courts of record, or elsewhere; and to purchase, receive, have, hold, and enjoy, to them and their successors, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, franchises, and hereditaments, goods and chattels, of Incorporated
