

within one month after such notice, which shall be conducted in all respects as is hereinbefore provided for.

SECTION 9. No misnomer of said corporation shall defeat or annul any gift, grant, devise or bequest to, or from the said corporation. *Provided*, That the intent of the parties shall sufficiently appear upon the face of the gift, grant, will or other writing, whereby any estate or interest was intended to pass to or from the said corporation. *Provided*, That nothing in this act or any other law of this commonwealth, shall entitle the said seminary, hereby incorporated, to receive the appropriation hereby granted to female seminaries and academies, by the fourth section of the act of the twelfth day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, entitled, a supplement to an act to consolidate and amend the several acts relative to a general system of education by common schools, passed the thirteenth of June, eighteen hundred and thirty-six.

## AN ACT

To incorporate the Monongahela City Fire Company of the borough of Monongahela.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Jefferson M'Clene, Charles Redding, W. H. King, W. P. Alexander, J. E. Alexander, Geo. M'Clenaken, Joel Woods, Jacob Court, S. B. Weimer, Abner Underwood, J. R. Shugard, Samuel Reynolds, Robert F. Cooper, William W. Thornton, Cyrus Underwood, and their associates, be, and they are hereby created and declared to be one body corporate and politic, by the name, style and title of "the Monongahela fire company of the borough of Monongahela city." and by the same name shall have perpetual

succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded in all courts of record or elsewhere, and to purchase, receive, have, hold and enjoy to them and their successors, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, franchises and hereditaments, goods and chatties, of what nature, kind or quality soever, real, personal or mixed, or choses in action, and the same, from time to time, to sell, grant, devise, alien or dispose of. *Provided*, That the clear yearly value or income of the real and personal estate of the said corporation shall not exceed the sum of two thousand dollars; and also to make and have a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure; and also to ordain, establish and put in execution such by-laws, ordinances and regulations as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of said corporation, not being contrary to this charter or to the constitution and laws of the United States or of this commonwealth, and generally to do all and singular, the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do for the well-being of said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof.

**SECTION 2.** That it shall be lawful for the chief council of the borough of Monongahela city to lay and collect a tax to be applied to the purchase of engine or engines, and suitable buildings for the protection of said engines, and for the protection of the buildings and engines aforesaid.

**SECTION 3.** That the following shall be the fundamental articles of the said corporation :

## ARTICLE I.

The object of the company shall be the promotion of the public good, by the extinguishment of fires.

## ARTICLE II.

The funds of the company shall be appropriated to no other objects than those for which the association was instituted.
