## AN ACT

For the relief of the Smithfield Cavalry Company, the Waynesburg Dragoons and Monongahela Riflemen, and for other purposes.

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be the duty of the adjutant general to furnish, upon the orders of the brigade inspector of the second brigade, ninth division, Pennsylvania militia, out of any arsenals of this commonwealth, when a sufficient number of arms and accoutrements may be had, the usual number of halsters and pistols, swords and belts, for the use of the Smithfield cavalry company, attached to the said brigade and division, for the use of the members thereof; likewise, to the orders of the inspector of the fourteenth division, (second brigade) a like number of arms and accoutrements, for the use of each member of the Waynesburg dragoons, a cavalry company in said brigade and division; likewise, to the orders of the same, a sufficient number of rifles for the use of the members of the Monongahela riflemen, a company attached to the fourteenth division of said brigade. *Provided,* Such arms and accoutrements shall be issued under such restrictions, provisions and securities, as are now required by law.

**SECTION 2.** That the adjutant general is hereby authorized and required to issue his requisition for the necessary arms and accoutrements, for the volunteer company called the "Old Codorus Riflemen," in the same manner, and for the same arms and accoutrements, as if the said company were among those volunteer companies entitled to arms and accoutrements, under the existing laws.

**SECTION 3.** That the act prescribing that volunteer companies not attached to a volunteer battalion, shall be attached to and trained with the militia on days of regimental or battalion training, be, and the same is hereby repealed, so far as respects the "Susquehanna rifle," of Wrightsville, in York county.

**SECTION 4.** That the canal commissioners be, and they are hereby authorized to permit, if they see proper, volunteer companies to travel on the public works of the state free of toll.

SECTION 5. That from and after the passage of this act, Schellsburg the Schellsburg guards, attached to the fifty-fifth regiment, Pennsylvania militia, shall be named instead thereof the Schellsburg artillery. *Provided*, That all acts done under the former name of Schellsburg Guards, shall not be affected in any manner by this act. guards changed to Schellsburg artillery

SECTION 6. That the said company is hereby authorized to elect an ensign, in the same manner as is by law prescribed for the election of other commissioned officers of volunteer companies, and that as such, he be entitled to receive a commission from the governor of this state. To elect an ensign

SECTION 7. That it shall be the duty of the adjutant general to furnish, for the use of the Schellsburg Artillery, one field piece of the calibre of six pounds, with all the apparatus and equipments complete, and it shall be the duty of the brigade inspector of the first brigade, twelfth division, Pennsylvania, to draw the said field piece and equipments, and deliver the same to the company aforesaid, and the expense thereof shall be defrayed out of the state treasury, to be paid to the said brigade inspector upon the settlement of his account. SECTION 8. That the commissioned officers shall receive commissions from the governor of the commonwealth, for the respective offices they hold in the said company of Schellsburg Artillery. Governor to issue commissions to officers

SECTION 9. That from and after the passage of this act, the Monongahela Blues and Washington Cavalry, in the counties of Fayette and Westmoreland, shall be exempted from parading or drilling with any regiment or battalion of militia, except at the discretion of the members of said companies. *Provided*, That the above named companies shall meet the proper number of days required by law in their company capacities. Monongahela blues and Washington cavalry not to train with militia
