## AN ACT

To incorporate the "Mannington Academy and Boarding School," in the township of Choconut, Susquehanna county.

Boarding school incorporated	<p><b>SECTION 1.</b> <i>Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,</i> That the Mannington academy and boarding school, for the education of youth, in the township of Choconut, Susquehanna county, at present under the direction of John Mann, as principal thereof, is hereby erected into one body corporate and politic, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "the Mannington academy and boarding school," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in any court of law or elsewhere, and shall be able and capable, in law and equity, to take and hold lands, tenements, goods and chattels, of whatever nature or quality, real, personal or mixed, which are now or may hereafter become the property of said academy by gift, grant, bargain, sale, conveyance, assurance, will, devise, bequest or otherwise, from any person or persons capable of making the same, and the same to grant, bargain, sell or dispose of. <i>Provided,</i> That the yearly value or income of the said real and personal estate, shall not at any time exceed the sum of two thousand dollars, to be applied exclusively for the erecting of such buildings as may be necessary, and for the purchase of books or of such apparatus for the use of said academy, and also, for such other purposes as may, from time to time, be necessary for the well being of the same, and that no misnomer shall defeat any gift, grant, or sale to the said academy, contrary to the true intent of the person or persons making the same.</p>

Names of trustees	<p><b>SECTION 2.</b> That the trustees of said academy shall be five in number, and until others shall be appointed, shall consist of the following named persons, to wit: John Mann, principal of said academy and boarding school, Joseph Mann, Lewis Mann, John S. Mann and Parvin Mann, and their respective successors, shall at all times be trustees of said academy by virtue of their said offices, and the said Lewis Mann shall continue in office until the first Monday in January next, the said John S. Mann to continue until the</p>
Of their continuance in office	

first Monday in January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, and the said Parvin Mann to continue until the first Monday in January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, on the several days aforesaid, and the same day yearly thereafter, the members of the said institution, at a general Annual election meeting to be held for that purpose, shall by ballot, elect one person out of their own number to serve as trustee for the term of three years. *Provided always*, That in case a vacancy or vacancies shall happen by death or otherwise, of any of the trustees appointed or elected, the remaining trustees or a majority of them, shall appoint a trustee or trustees until the next general meeting or election, at which meeting the members of said institution shall elect another trustee or trustees to supply said vacancy or vacancies, as the case may be. Proviso  
Of vacancies

SECTION 3. That the said trustees, any three of whom, the said principal being one, being a quorum, shall have Power of trustees power to manage the said concerns of the academy, to have the funds thereof in their care, to change the annual meetings for the election of trustees, from time to time, as they may find convenient, to appoint a secretary and treasurer, and to determine all matters and things necessary to the good order and well being of the said academy, to enact and enforce such by-laws and ordinances as they may think proper for the management of the same. *Provided always*, That the said by-laws and ordinances shall not be inconsistent with the constitution of this state, or of the United States. *And provided further*, That the internal government of the academy shall be entirely under the direction of the principal thereof, and the said by-laws and all the proceedings of the said trustees, shall fairly and regularly be entered in books to be kept for that purpose. Proviso

SECTION 4. That the principal of said academy and his successors, shall remain in said office until he or they shall be removed, according to the stated rules and regulations of the said institution or otherwise, and all vacancies which may arise by such removal, shall be supplied according to the same rules. Of the continuance in office, and removal of principal

SECTION 5. That the said trustees and their successors, shall have full power and authority to use one common seal, and to alter and renew the same at pleasure. *Provided always*, That the legislature reserves the right to alter, amend or annul this charter, at any time hereafter that they may think proper. Seal

SECTION 6. That the said corporation shall not be entitled to receive the annual appropriation made to academies by the fourth section of an act, passed the twelfth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, entitled, "a supplement Corporation not to receive annual appropriation"

## AN ACT

To incorporate the Hollidaysburg Academy.

Academy incorporated	SECTION I. <i>Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,</i> That there shall be, and hereby is established in the borough of Hollidaysburg, in the county of Huntingdon, and commonwealth of Pennsylvania, an academy or public school, for the education of youth in the English and other languages, by the name of the Hollidaysburg academy, under the care, direction and government of the trustees, viz: John Walker, William Williams, Peter Howitt, James Coffey, Jacob Snyder, Alexander Ennis and Jeremiah Cunningham, and which said trustees and their successors, to be elected as hereinafter directed, shall be, and are hereby declared to be one body corporate and politic, by the name and style of "the trustees of the Hollidaysburg academy," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, plead, and be impleaded in all courts of record and elsewhere, and shall be competent and capable in law and equity, to take and to hold to them and their successors, for the use of the said academy, lands, tenements, hereditaments, goods and chattels, of what kind, nature or quality, whatsoever, real, personal and mixed, by gift, grant, bargain, sale or conveyance, assurance, will, devise or bequest, from any person or persons, whomsoever, capable of making the same, and the same, from time to time, to grant, bargain, sell, demise, alien, dispose of, for the use of said academy, and generally to do all and singular, the matters and things which shall be lawful for them to do for the well being of said
