

every share of stock he shall hold, up to twenty shares, and no stockholder shall have more than twenty votes.

RESOLVED, That the said Warren bridge company shall go into operation without the concurrence of the act of the legislature of the state of New Jersey, as required by the sixteenth section of the act of the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five: *Provided*, That said bridge shall not be constructed across the Conewango creek, or any of its branches, and that so much of the said last mentioned act, as authorizes an increase of the capital stock of said company, shall apply to the said Warren bridge company.

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met*, That the election, held by the citizens of said borough, on the eleventh day of August last, is hereby declared valid, to all intents and purposes, as if the same had been held agreeable to the fifth section of an act declaring Wooden bridge creek, in the county of Bedford, a public highway, and for other purposes, passed the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight.
