RESOLUTION

For the relief of John M'Carty.

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met,* That the auditor general be, and he is hereby empowered and required to audit and allow certain orders now held by John M'Carty, late brigade inspector, of the second brigade; twelfth division of the Pennsylvania militia, issued in the years eighteen hundred eighteen, nineteen, twenty, and twenty-one, by Colonels Michael Dively and Peter Will, on John Patton, paymaster of the thirteenth regiment of Pennsylvania militia: *Provided,* The same shall not exceed two hundred eighty dollars, twenty-five cents, with interest from the first day of January, A. D., eighteen hundred and twenty-two, and that the same be paid by warrant of the auditor general, on the state treasurer, in the usual manner.
